Bred By Little Brook Farm
Brownsville, Vermont

Triple S Wings of Wind is a substantial 15.2 hand stallion who exhibits beautiful extension and impulsion of gait along with very correct conformation. He was a successful Ranch horse for his previous owner, and produces athletic, solid foals for Polly Smith at Little Brook Farm. Just as he has in the past produced solid, sound Morgans who have made it as working ranch horses for his previous owners. The Painter's of Triple S Morgans currently retain several of his daughters in their broodmare band. Daughters who have been consistently very good producers. That they should be, and that the Little Brook Farm get of Wings of Wind should be athletic comes as no surprise when one looks more closely at the breeding behind Wings of Wind.

Triple S Red Wind, (Triple S Red Major X Red Madge). Wings of Wind's sire, is listed as a 15.3 hand chestnut stallion. He was sired by Triple S Red Major, also bred by The Painters, again, a chestnut stallion, but with a lighter mane and tail. Red Major was by Blackwood Correll, a black stallion, 15.3 hands, bred by B. Wallace Mills of Nebraska. Blackwood Correll was sired by the legendary Red Correll. Red Correll was a dark chestnut stallion bred by C.G. Stevenson of Iowa. He sired 92 foals. In turn Red Correll was sired by Will Rogers. Will Rogers and Red Correll were upheaded horses with totally correct conformation, of great strength, stamina, and soundness. They are considered Pure Old Midwest breeding- as they should be coming from Iowa and Nebraska. The sire of Will Rogers was Herod Panic by Herod Golddusty. Again, this is Old Midwest breeding of the best sort. The line from Herod Panic and Herod Golddusty goes back to Black Hawk by Sherman Morgan, in the following order: Herod Golddusty by Winterset by Captain Jack, by Morgan Jack by Prince Herod by Hercules by Herod by King Herod by Sherman Black Hawk by Black Hawk by Sherman. The Herods were black horses of 15 hands, frequently 15.2 and weighing in the neighborhood of 1,200 lbs. They were a very solid, hard working,

sane family. This then is the sire line alone of Triple S Wings of Wind and it is a very impressive one indeed.

Since a sire line, no matter how illustrious the horses in it may be, in this case Winterset, Red Correll, and Will Rogers especially, is only part of the equation that makes up any given horse -it is time to look at the paternal dam side of Triple S Wings of Wind's pedigree.

The dam of Triple S Red Wind, (sire of Triple S Wings of Wind) was Red Madge. She was a 1968 chestnut mare. She produced seven foals, all carrying the Triple S prefix, and four of whom were by Red Major. The sire of Red Madge was Shawalla Major and her dam was Red Butie. Shawalla Major had a tail male sire line going back to Jubilee King through Juzan then his son Agazizz, then down to Silver Rockwood (whose dam May Rockwood is also behind Blackwood Correll), to Rockfield. Rockfield was a very substantial horse who was the sire of 124 registered get. Silver Rockwood, sire of Rockfield, was a flaxen chestnut, as was his sire Agazizz (Juzan X Gizea). This is Brunk breeding. Agazizz had 71 registered get. The dam of Rockfield was Katrina Field by Sonfield- out of Blazie Q by Querido out of Katrina. Katrina was linebred to Headlight Morgan on both her sire and dam's sides. Headlight Morgan was at the heart of the famous Sellman breeding program. Katrina Field was bred by Roland Hill of California, as was her dam Blazie Q. Sonfield was by Mansfield out of Quietude by Troubadour of Willowmoor- who went back to Sherman Morgan. This is a departure from the Old Midwest breeding of the Herods, but still within a close relationship as May Rockwood was bred by Elmer Brown of Halstead, KS. Elmer Brown was a very highly regarded breeder and his mares were much sought by other breeders, especially those who were breeding real working horses, and down to today in many WWF (Working Western Family) breeders. The departure lies in the addition of the Jubilee King blood.

The dam of Shawalla Major was Madene by Fleetfield (Mentor x Norma). Fleetfield was a full brother to the highly regarded Eastern Park Horse show stallion Trophy. This is classic US Government Farm breeding. Madene herself was a Jackson Ranch

bred mare. The Jacksons got Fleetfield at the Government Farm dispersal sale. The Trophy horses were known for their high action, being rather hot and being plain headed, they were also known as being tough horses. Fleetfield represents typical US Government farm breeding of that time. Mentor's sire was Goldfield by Mansfield (Bennington X Artemsia) and he was out of Juno a General Gates granddaughter. Mentor himself was out of Fairytop (Delmont X Topaz). Delmont was by Ulysses (full brother to Mansfield) out of Ladelle, a saddlebred mare. Topaz was by Mansfield. Norma, the dam of Fleetfield , was by Canfield, another full brother to Mansfield, out of Romance by Bennington. Indeed very typical US Government Farm breeding patterns. Fleetfield sired 45 Registered Morgans, all of whom seem to be out of early Jackson Ranch mares. Madene was out of Claudine who was by Red Racer out of Traveler's Choice. Red Racer was by Delbert who was by Revere by Mansfield X Folly- a Bennington daughter. Traveler's Choice goes back to Daniel Lambert five times through Jubilee De Jarnette via Quintessence. Along with the five crosses to Daniel Lambert, Traveler's Choice has three lines to Golddust an extremely elegant golden bay stallion, who combined the blood of Woodbury and Sherman Morgan. Golddust was a magnificent horse who stood at stud in Kentucky, and was considered the fastest trotting horse of the day. He sired over 300 foals, only 87 of which were Registered Morgan. Delbert was from the Miles City Remount Station , his dam was Alibirdi, a Sellman bred mare who was a granddaughter of Headlight Morgan and also of Red Oak by General Gates.

Red Racer's dam was Katelina a daughter of Chief Bugler who was a double grandson of Jubilee De Jarnette, his two granddams were both by Lambert Boy with mare lines going back to Black Hawk Morgan.. This breeding is that of C.X. Larrabee. Troubadour Of Willowmoor standing at the Government Farm was the sire of Quietude, dam of Sonfield. Here through Katelina is more concentrated Sherman Morgan blood.

The dam of Red Madge was Red Butie by Silverton Morgan who was by Morgan Gold

who was by Red Correll (who was the sire of Blackwood Correll) . Morgan Gold's dam was Luellen , a smoky black mare from the LU Sheep Co. Ranch in Wyoming. Luellen's dam was Ethete by Flyhawk out of Sue, an unregistered daughter of Linspar who was by Linsley by General Gates and out of Sparbelle by Sparhawk- who goes back to King Herod by Sherman Black Hawk. Night Tide was the sire of Luellen. Night Tide was by Tiffany (by Mansfield) out of the Allen King daughter Glenalla. Allen King's blood goes back to Daniel Lambert via Ben Franklin and back to Jubilee De Jamette twice. In addition Allen King carried the blood of Charles Reade who had three crosses to Black Hawk and was himself triple registered as Morgan, Saddlebred, and Standardbred. Allen King was a full brother to Penrod, the sire of Jubilee King.

Red Butie's dam was Red Girl by Burkey out of Bonny Jean. Burkey is all Old Midwest breeding being by Rosevelt out of Queen Mae. Rosevelt was by Winterset, behind Red Correll and Blackwood Correll. Rosevelt, though not terribly widely found in modern pedigrees, was a very handsome horse who contributed great type and quality to his descendants. Queen Mae goes back to King Herod Jr. through her sire line and her dam was Potena, who was also the dam of Midnight Beauty who was the dam of Herod Panic. Bonnie Jean however, was by Rosin by Red Oak by General Gates and her dam was Montana Maid by De Jarnette Jr. Alice Dean was the dam of Montana Maid, and she went back to King Herod who goes back to Black Hawk by Sherman Morgan on both sides of his pedigree. Bonnie Jean is Old Montana breeding.

Iyoksica was the dam of Silverton Morgan. She was bred by the Oglala Community HS in Pine Ridge , SD. She had some of the old Montana CX Larrabee breeding which was used and sought by ranchers in the area. Her sire was Highland Glen who was by Justin's Silhouette X Beauty Panic. Highland Glen was by Justins Silhouette out of Sprite by Escort. Both of Justins Silhouette's parents go back to Sherman Morgan though Quintessence as well as going back to Golddust who went back to Gifford Morgan and to Sherman Morgan and is mentioned in the pedigree

of Traveler's Choice, dam of Red Racer. Sprite, on the other hand was bred by The Maxwell Lodge in WA, and later was owned by J.E. Rockwood of Kalispell, MT. She was a winning cow horse. Her sire was Escort who is old Government breeding, going back to General Gates three times in five generations. Sprite's dam was Nymph, also of US Government Farm breeding, but she carried Troubadour of Willowmoor, (he was bred by C.W. Clise of Redmond, WA, but later stood at the Government farm), as her sire. Her dam was Helen Gates, by General Gates out of the Daniel Lambert daughter Caroline.

Beauty Panic, the dam of Highland Glen was all Old Midwest breeding. She was by Herod Panic out of Midnight Beauty. Herod Panic was also the sire of Will Rogers. Herod Panic's sire Herod Golddusty was by Winterset, and Herod Panic's dam-Midnight Beauty was by Winterset. Again, we see the concentration of Sherman Morgan's blood. Miga who was the dam of Herod Panic was also by Winterset. She was another strongly bred Sherman Morgan horse, with a line to Golddust. It is much the same with Potena, dam of Midnight Beauty.

Thus behind Triple S Red Wind and Triple S Wings of Wind through him there is a great deal of Sherman Morgan, Old Midwest, Old Montana, and Old Washington State breeding. Quite a sire line indeed with many crosses to the wonderful, and handsome Winterset as well as more than a few lines to Red Oak, long considered the best of the General Gates sons. Quintessence is here in abundance, and is known to always have added a special something to any pedigree, as has Golddust, few though his Morgan get were.

The dam's side of Triple S Wings of Wind – that of Primavera Ramona is also a very strongly bred side. Primavera Ramona, as her prefix indicates, was bred by Richard and Phyllis Nelsen of California. The Primavera horses are highly regarded and sought by today's breeders of Working Western Family (WWF) Morgans. Primavera Ramona has produced thirteen foals, including among them the well known Reining Horse- Painter's Pine Ridge, bred by Polly Smith and now owned by the Filipecks.

Ramona has produced for Little Brook Farm, and for Triple S Morgans primarily. The sire of Primavera Ramona was Juan Bravo, also bred by the Nelsens, and her dam was El-Mira Rexanne bred by Earl R. Buss of Grafton, Ohio. The El-Mira prefix is synonymous with Linsley bred horses, and here again, by those seeking to improve athletic ability in their stock- it is highly sought.

Juan Bravo, sire of Primavera Ramona, was by the legendary stallion Califomio. He also was bred by The Nelsens when they lived in Ohio. The dam of Juan Bravo was the very well known and highly respected mare Re-Wind of Sundown. Juan Bravo was a Reining Horse Champion, just as his grandson Painter's Pine Ridge is. Juan Bravo sired only seven Morgan get according to AMHA records. Primavera Ramona and her half brother Primavera Regalo owned by Roy Foote, Treasure Morgans in Montana, are perhaps the best known, and most productive of Juan Bravo's get.

Califomio, also bred by The Nelsens, was a 1967 Palomino stallion who sired 54 get and has left his mark, though his get, all over the North American continent. He was not a big, tall horse, but he was a most impressive stallion. He was used for all kinds of riding, English, Jumping, and of course Western. His family is known not only for the lovely Palomino color they often have, but for their athletic ability. He was sired by Tio Lalo, palomino, bred by E.N. Vail of Los Angeles, California. Tio Lalo was shown and won in Western Pleasure. Tio Lalo left nineteen registered get.

He was sired by the Sonfield son Mahan Field out of Helen Mala. Mahan Field was bred by Roland Hill of California. while Mr. Hill owned Sonfield. This is US Government Farm breeding on both sides. But since Sonfield stood in California, it can also be considered as California breeding. Sonfield was by Mansfield out of Quietude a daughter of Troubadour of Willowmoor. Ruth was the dam of Quietude. She was a 1915 Vermont bred mare by Reynard out of Laura Jay. Ruth goes back to Sherman Morgan through Billy Roberts on both sides of her pedigree. She also has multiple crosses to Sherman through The Streeter Horse and through Billy Root

and The Bodette Horse. So Sonfield was a blend of the old Government breeding and that of Daniel Lambert through Jubilee De Jamette going back to Sherman Morgan.

Sissy was the dam of Californio, she by Ro Mac by Gay Mac out of Berta Sonfield by Sonfield. This is old US Government Farm breeding indeed, even though she was foaled in California, bred by Dr. CC Reed of Compton, CA.

Mansfield was by Bennington out of Artemsia- perhaps the most famous breeding of the US Government Farm. Bennington was by General Gates who was sired by Denning Allen and who has many crosses back to Sherman Morgan again through his sire Honest Allen. The historical story goes that Joseph Battell admired Honest Allen greatly and when years later his son Denning Allen came up for public sale Joseph Battell bought him. Honest Allen had a race time of 2:28 to pole . Denning Allen sired the race gelding Lord Clinton, who was extremely admired by Mr. Battell, but as a gelding would not do as a breeding horse, which is why in part he bought Denning Allen when he became available.

Artemsia was of what is known as Ancient Vermont Lineage- she was by Ethan Allen 3rd. out of Lady Laura (Harrison Orcutt Mare) who was sired by Bob Morgan. Ethan Allen 3rd goes back to Sherman Morgan and to Woodbury Morgan as well as to Bulrush Morgan. On her pedigree are found such famous names as Black Morgan, Morgan Tiger, Green Mountain Morgan, Hale's Green Mountain, Cushings Green Mountain, Ethan Allen 50, and the Dr. Abel Brown Horse.

Helen Mala, the dam of Mahan Field was bred by Roland G. Hill of California. She was a 1938 brown mare of pure Sellman breeding being by Headlight Morgan out of Baby Lu. Headlight Morgan was by Ethan Allen 2nd, out of Lady Stratton who goes back to Woodbury Morgan where Ethan Allen 2nd, goes back to Justin Morgan though his son Red Robin. So here within Headlight Morgan are lines to Woodbury Morgan, Red Robin, and Black Hawk to Sherman Morgan. Black Hawk comes in through Ethan Allen 50 grandsire of Ethan Allen 2nd. Baby Lu , dam of Helen Mala,

brings in the blood of The Admiral and Major Antoine her maternal grandfather. The Admiral by Jubilee De Jamette brings in Sherman Morgan through Daniel Lambert via Jubilee Lambert and in addition brings in Bulrush Morgan through his dam Morrill Queen through Winnebago Chief. She also brings in Revenge by Justin Morgan, and Black Hawk by Sherman Morgan through her dam Olive.

Emma Antoine was the dam of Baby Lu. She was by Major Antoine out of Topsy. This cross that of The Admiral and Major Antoine is classic Sellman breeding. Major Antoine was by Meteor Jr. who traces back to Sherman Morgan via Black Hawk, and Black Hawk's son Chieftain. Through the dam of Meteor Jr- Nell Bird comes a line to Woodbury Morgan. Through Emma Antoine's dam comes another line to Bulrush Morgan and two more to Woodbury Morgan. This is a very carefully done blend of not only the major sons of Justin Morgan, but includes two of the lesser known sons, Red Robin, and Revenge as well as The Hawkins Horse by Justin Morgan who comes into this pedigree through Emma Antoine's great grandfather Octoroon. This then is the contribution of MahanField to Primavera Ramona through Califonio's sire Tio Lalo.

Palomesa was the dam of Tio Lalo, she by Midnight Sun out of Baby O. It is Palomesa who contributed the palomino coloring that came down to Califonio. She was a palomino mare, foaled in 1947, and bred by SM Salisbury of Los Angeles, California. Tio Lalo was her only registered Morgan offspring. Tio Lalo looked amazingly like his grandsire Midnight Sun – testimony to breeding strength indeed. Midnight Sun was double registered with both the Morgan and Palomino Associations. He sired 19 foals, and was foaled in 1943. His sire Sun Down Morgan was owned by Merle Little of CA from the age of twelve on. Mr. Little used him as a parade horse, a trail horse and a stock horse. SunDown Morgan was a very handsome, upstanding horse with a great deal of presence. He sired 29 foals. His breeding goes back to Bulrush Morgan on the top line through Raven Chief, Morgan Chief, Chief Morgan, to Julian Morgan by Winnebago Chief. This is all Bulrush breeding. Raven Chief was bred by Richard Sellman, who had purchased his sire Morgan Chief earlier. Morgan Chief was Midwest bred and only had 4 progeny

registered. Richard Sellman took this Bulrush bred horse and bred him to Baby Girl, a 1910 chestnut mare doing what became a classic Sellman pattern. She was by The Admiral out of a mare who was a daughter of both Major Gordon and Major Antoine. Really setting the pattern with the breeding of Raven Chief in combining the Old Midwestern bloodlines.

The dam of SunDown Morgan was the Sellman bred mare Texsky, she by Texas Allen out of Frisky by Gold Medal. This line of Sellman breeding combines Sherman, Bulrush and Woodbury Morgan. Texsky went back to Headlight Morgan- the Woodbury and Sherman lines; Gold Medal, going back to Woodbury, Bulrush and the lessor known Hawkins Horse by Justin Morgan, as well as Sherman Morgan. Her pedigree contains the bloodlines of the sire of Texas Allen, Easter Allen Morgan by Headlight Morgan, Flying Morrill, The Hanchett Horse, Bessie Morgan, Nell Bird with her contribution of Black Hawk- in short a very good representation of all the best of the original breed bloodlines.

DawnGlo, dam of Midnight Sun is of different breeding. She was a 1939 Palomino mare, registered as Creme, bred by the LU Sheep Company, Dickie Wyoming and owned by Helen Greenwalt. Her sire was Night Tide by Tiffany by Mansfield. Night Tide's dam was Glenalla- the daughter of Allen King and Ruby Reade. Ruby Reade had the blood of Jubilee De Jarnette, Bess Franklin by the Daniel Lambert grandson Chetco by Ben Franklin, Ethan Allen 50 by Black Hawk by Sherman- so the Glenalla line was just about pure Sherman Morgan, heavily through Daniel Lambert. While Night Tide, DawnGlo's sire was on his sire line, pure old Government breeding. An interesting combination indeed.

Ishawoowa was the dam of DawnGlo. She was by Linspar by Linsley whose sire line was Old Government breeding, but whose dam Sunflower Maid was by Headlight Morgan. Ishawoowa was another LU Mare, whose sire was Flyhawk and her dam was Coalie out of an unregistered mare who was the granddaughter of Dan Patch an American Trotting Registered stallion who traced to Star of the West, and

Black Hawk 20 among others. This is characteristic of early LU breeding which was daughters of Flyhawk, out of un-registered mares who traced back to Morgan bloodlines then bred to Linspar.

Re-Wind of Sundown was the dam of Juan Bravo, she was by Siskiyou Thor (Ryder X Shasta Girl). Siskiyou Thor 's sire Ryder was a Sonfield son, out of a Querido daughter -Angel A- who traces back to Texas Allen who Sellman used. She also carried the other well known Sellman stock such as Angelina and through Moleskin she goes back to the classic Sellman pattern of Headlight Morgan on daughters of The Admiral and Major Gordon. Re-Wind Of Sundown was herself a very well known mare , of , I think Cutting Horse renown.

Shasta Girl, Thor's dam was by North Fork out of Georgette. North Fork was a Querido grandson, who's paternal granddam was the pure Sellman mare Addy. North Fork's dam was Roverta who on her sire line goes to Allen King, full brother to Penrod- sire of Jubilee King . Roverta was out of Roboss who was Red Oak by General Gates out of Sellman mare Bossie A. Again here is a blend of Old Government, Daniel Lambert , and Bulrush Morgan. Shasta Girl's dam Georgette was by the exquisite Mountcrest Sellman, out of Frisky A- another of Sellman's superb mares. Mountcrest Sellman is a name which when it appears on a pedigree almost always guarantee's a splendid offspring one which continue to pass on Mountcrest Sellman's fine conformation and high quality.

El Blazie was the dam of Re-Wind of Sundown. She was by El Cortez, a good son of the powerful and highly regarded Romanesque by Red Oak out of Mariah K. an extremely well known Sellman mare.. Romanesque was her only progeny but what a contribution to the breed he was. El Cortez was out of the Linsley daughter Viola Linsley , she being out of old Donbelle of classic Old Vermont, Ancient Morgan breeding.

El-Mira Rexanne was the dam of Primavera Ramona. She was by Rex Linsley who

on his sire line is pure old Government breeding, going to Linsley of course, and with two crosses to Headlight Morgan. Rex Linsley's paternal granddam was Racher who was by Silver Ranger (Querido X Angelina) Angelina was a Sellman bred mare. The dam of Racher was Dan's Bess by Dan by Headlight Morgan . Dan's Bess was out of Lady Skinner . Lady Skinner was a Headlight Morgan daughter who went back to both Bulrush Morgan and Woodbury Morgan. This is old Midwestern breeding. Rex Linsley also carried the blood of Jubilee King through his dam Nelda L.J. by Jekyll out of Neliza , a very famous Jubilee King daughter. Racher was bred by WP Thornhill of Texas, and marks the beginning of the spread of Sellman mares to other owners.

El-Mira Rexanne's dam was Apache Maid who was by Highland Glen who was also the sire of Iyoksica who was the dam of Silverton Morgan. Apache Maid's dam was Brick by the Bennington son Swanton X Carolyn of old Vermont /Sherman breeding. Brick's dam was Mountain Dawn by Rosin a Red Oak son . Rosin's dam was Sunset Morgan , a Headlight Morgan granddaughter as well as a Julian Morgan granddaughter- the very same pattern as the earliest Sellman breeding. Mountain Dawn's dam was Montana Sunshine by De Jamette Jr. X Alice Dean who went back to King Herod.

Treasure Brightsun (Primavera Regalo X Treasure Incantation). Her sire ,Primavera Regalo , a 1974 dark chestnut stallion of 15.1 hands was sired by Juan Bravo, out of Belle Meade. Juan Bravo being the sire of Primavera Ramona who is a half sister to Primavera Regalo- Juan Bravo's contribution to LBF Amazing Grace is to be found above.

Belle Meade , the dam of Primavera Regalo, was a 1954 chestnut mare, bred by the LU Sheep Company of Worland, WY. She produced eleven foals , seven of them colts. She was by Townshend Gaymeade out of Charmine, a Senator Graham daughter out of Mallow. Her sire, Townshend Gaymeade was a 15.2 hand dark chestnut stallion bred by Anna Ela , Townshend Farm Morgans, of Townshend, Vermont. Gaymeade was a very prolific stallion, siring eighty four registered foals.

He stood at stud at the LU for four years. He is rather prevalent throughout the current Working Western Family pedigrees. On his sire line Gaymeade is all US Government Farm breeding being by Meade out of Gayselba, even though Gayselba was bred by Dr. WL Orcutt, as was her dam Ulyselba. Mansfield, Ulysses, Glady, and Gay Mac are all present behind Gayselba.

Glady was the dam of Meade, she was by Mansfield out of Lady Sealect, by Sealect out of the Knox Morgan daughter My Lady Knox. Glady was bred by the US Government Farm and her dam Lady Sealect as well as being a Knox Morgan granddaughter, was also a Knox Morgan great granddaughter though Sealect's dam Belle Marea who was also by Knox Morgan.

Gayselba was by Gay Mac. Gay Mac in turn was by the US Government Morgan Horse Farm premier stallion Mansfield. Mansfield was by Bennington by General Gates out of Mrs. Culvers. It is almost impossible to find a Morgan Horse today without Mansfield on the papers. So wide an influence has Mansfield had. Mrs. Culvers the dam of Bennington was brought into the Government Farm breeding program from KY, in an effort to increase size in the herd. She was a great granddaughter of Gist's Black Hawk Morgan by Blood's Vermont Black Hawk, by Black Hawk, son of Sherman Morgan- one of the three most famous breeding sons of Justin Morgan. General Gates was by Denning Allen out of Fanny Scott, a mare of primarily Thoroughbred breeding.

Denning Allen, however was all Morgan, with multiple crosses to Sherman Morgan through Black Hawk. Denning Allen also carries a cross to Woodbury Morgan, and one, more rare to Red Robin, another son of Justin Morgan, though a lesser known son.

Artemisia was the dam of Mansfield, and through her is a link to what is considered as Ancient Morgan lineage breeding. She was by Ethan Allen 3rd out of the Harrison Orcutt Mare. Ethan Allen 3rd (Borden's) was by Ethan Allen 2nd (Peter's) son of Peter's Vermont by Green Mountain Morgan and going back to Gifford Morgan by Woodbury Morgan, another of the three most famous breeding sons of Justin

Morgan. The cross of Bennington and Artemsia has long been considered a “golden cross” and it is one which has produced the backbone of not only the WWF, but of all of today's Morgans who can be considered of Government breeding. This then is the top sire line of Gay Vaquero- pure old US Government Farm breeding. On Artemsia's pedigree one finds the names that rank among the most famous in the early years of the breed – Cushings Green Mountain, Billy Root, Hale's Green Mountain, Black Morgan, The Batchelder Horse, The Levi Wilder mare, and yet another of Justin Morgan's lessor known sons-The Hawkins Horse.

Dewdrop the dam of Gay Mac was by General Gates out of Ellen. Ellen was a Vermont bred mare, standing 15.2 hands with nine crosses to Justin Morgan, through all three famous sons, Sherman, Woodbury, and Bulrush. She was owned and registered by Joseph Battell and kept as a broodmare at the Government Farm. She produced 14 foals, 13 of whom were filly foals. She was a big, smooth, up-headed mare and beautifully bred. She was one of the best of the Government broodmares. Ellen carried her line to Bulrush through Morrill, by The Jennison Colt a grandson of Bulrush. Gifford Morgan by Woodbury is on her pedigree as well as Motion by Daniel Lambert going back to Sherman Morgan.

Ulyselba, the dam of Gayselba, was by Ulysses out of Melba. Ulysses was a full brother to Mansfield. Melba was by Jerome Morgan out of Eudora. Jerome Morgan goes back to Sherman Morgan through Billy Root 9, and back to Woodbury Morgan through King's Billy Root as well through Hales Green Mountain Morgan by Gifford Morgan.

Eudora, dam of Melba was by General Gates and out of Babe by Bob Morgan. Eudora brings in Daniel Lambert bloodlines through her grandsire Cobden, a Daniel Lambert son.

This is the top side of Belle Meade's pedigree- US Government , Lu Sheep Co., with strong lines to both Daniel Lambert and Knox Morgan.

Charmaine was the dam of Belle Meade. She was a daughter of Senator Graham out of Mallow. Charmaine was bred by J & BL Dove of Sorento, Illinois. She was a very prolific mare, producing a total of fourteen foals, twelve of whom were filly foals. Mallow was bred by the LU Sheep Company, her sire was Linspar by Linsley-US Government Farm breeding – Linsley was by General Gates out of the Headlight Morgan daughter Sunflower Maid.

Mallow's dam was Larkspur by Flyhawk. Larkspur was out of a daughter of Morgan Patch who traced to Dan Patch, a trotting bred stallion. Mallow produced thirteen foals, five colts and eight filly foals. She passed on her excellent breeding production to her daughter Charmaine.

Senator Graham, sire of Charmaine, was a 1940 chestnut stallion bred by Elmer Brown of Halstead, KS. He sired forty colts and seventy eight filly foals. Indeed he and his get are legion throughout the entire Morgan breed. Senator Graham was purchased by the Brown Brothers from Elmer Brown, and then sold to Robert Tynan, Jr of Stella, Nebraska. From Mr. Tynan he was purchased by the LU Sheep Company. He was used as both a Ranch horse at the LU and later on as a winning show horse. His pedigree is a wonderful blend of old bloodlines on both sides. He was sired by Senator Knox, who was a 15.2 hand chestnut bred by JC Brunk. Senator Knox was Champion Morgan of both the Iowa and Minnesota State Fairs as well as being part of the US Remount Program. He was sired by Knox Morgan and out of JC Brunk's beautiful mare Senata by Senator out of Daisy by Billy Bodette. Senator Knox therefore carried a very strong infusion of Sherman Morgan through not only Black Hawk, but through Billy Root 9, Billy Bodette, Chieftan and Royal Morgan among other Shermans. Senator Knox also had Woodbury Morgan behind him, through Gifford Morgan and Spragues Ethan Allen who was a double Woodbury Morgan horse.

Fanita was the dam of Senator Graham. She was by Tiffany by Mansfield out of Klyona. Tiffany was foaled in Middlebury, Vt, and later transferred to JC Brunk in exchange for Brunk's stallion Allen King. A mare- Juliette by name was included in

the trade to JC Brunk. Fanita's dam was Benita by Knox Morgan out of Ben's Daisy by Ben Franklin. So here is a combination of US Government breeding with that of Daniel Lambert blood. Fanita was bred by JC Brunk, and was another prolific mare producing eleven foals-six filly foals and five colts.

This is the top side of Treasure Brightsuns' pedigree, that of her sire Primavera Regalo.

Treasure Incantation , dam of Treasure Brightsun, was sired by Shazam, a bay stallion foaled in 1970, bred by Patricia and Donald Long of Johnstown, NY. Her dam was Tia Isabella by Califomio. Shazam was sired by Lord Linsley who in turn was sired by Linsley Lee and out of Sunflower Belle. Lord Linsley was a triple great, great grandson of the US Government bred stallion Linsley. Two of those three crosses to Linsley are through Elberty Linsley the dam of Lord Linsley's paternal and maternal great grand parents.. On the top side that would be Linbar by Barberry, and on the bottom side that would be through Isobel. by Bob Romanesque. The third cross to Linsley comes through Lisabelle the dam of Sunflower Maid's sire-Larry Colonel. Linsley Lee was by Felix Lee by Allen Lee by Jubilee King. Allen Lee's dam was Allestra by Flyhawk's sire Go Hawk and out of Mrs. Lewis by Charles Reade out of Bess Franklin by Chetco the very well known son of Ben Franklin. This is all Sherman breeding and double Daniel Lambert breeding. The dam of Felix Lee was Fanita (dam of Senator Graham) by Tiffany out of Benita by Knox Morgan out of Ben's Daisy by Ben Franklin by Daniel Lambert.

Allen Lee, and Fanita were bred by JC Brunk, while Felix Lee was bred by the Chilocco Agricultural School. Linsley Lee was also bred by Chilocco Agricultural School. Tiffany , sire of Fanita was bred at Middlebury, Vt and he was sired by Mansfield out of Klyona a General Gates granddaughter and great granddaughter. Once again we see the pattern of US Government Farm breeding crossed with Daniel Lambert.

Linbar's sire Barberry was bred by H. Greenwalt, a 1937 solid bay stallion. He was sired by the Tiffany son Night Tide and his dam was Betty Barr by Penrod. Penrod of course was the sire of Jubilee King. Betty Barr's dam was the Knox Morgan daughter- Daisy Knox who was out of the Jubilee De Jarnette daughter Daisy De Jarnette whose dam was Ben's Daisy , also the dam of Benita. Night Tide's dam was Glenalla by Allen King X Ruby Reade. Allen King was the full brother to Penrod, sire of Jubilee King. Ruby Reade was by Charles Reade out of the Jubilee De Jarnette daughter Ruby, whose dam was Bess Franklin by Chetco.

There is yet a fourth cross to Linsley on Shazam's sire line. That being through Isobel's sire Bob Romanesque who was out of the Linsley daughter Maggy Linsley. All of which , in addition to the quantities of Daniel Lambert and the US Government bred stallions made Shazam one very athletic horse on the sire side alone.

The dam of Shazam was Shadell. She was by the Flyhawk son Shadow Hawk and out of Dell's Melody by Plainsman.

Shadow Hawk was a black , 1947 foal, bred by Sam Doak of Illinois who sold him to Canada, where he became a working ranch horse and from where he was later bought by the Brunk family in 1960. He was the prolific sire of twenty seven colts and twenty four filly foals. Shadow Hawk was out of Sentimental. She by Major Reade by Charles Reade. JC Brunk's beautiful mare Senata was the dam of Sentiment. Sentimental's dam was the Sentiment daughter Bonnie Blue. Bonnie Blue was out of the red roan mare Roany, who had a line back to the Black Hawk Morgan.

Dell's Melody, the dam of Shadell was sired by Plainsman, who was according to the AMHA 2003 CD, bred by the Estate of Helen Greenwalt. Plainsman was by Plains King out of Sentola- full sister to Jubilee King. Plains King was by Romanesque by Red Oak by General Gates. Romanesque was out of the Headlight Morgan daughter Mariah K. who was out of Sweet Marie by The Admiral.. Mariah K. was bred by Richard Sellman. The dam of Plains King was the Linsley daughter Ella Linsley, she was out of Lemax by Sparhawk. Lemax was bred by Elmer Brown of Halstead, KS

and she goes back to Ben Franklin, Gifford Morgan, Captain Herod, Ethan Allen 2nd and Reconstruction. Sherman and Woodbury Morgan combined.

The dam of Dell's Melody was the oddly named Rubby out of the Jubilee King daughter Madell whose dam was Tirzo by Go Hawk. Galva was the dam of Tirzo, she was a granddaughter of both Herod (goes back to Sherman Black Hawk), and Chetco by Ben Franklin as well as carrying Billy Bodette and Green Mountain Boy who carried a line to Brutus, a lesser known son of Justin Morgan.

Tia Isabella was the dam of Treasure Incantation. She was sired by Califonio and out of OH-Cee's Gift. Califonio was the sire of Primavera Regalo's sire- Juan Bravo, as well being the sire of Primavera Ramona- dam of Triple S Wings of Wind.

OH-Cee's Gift was sired by Montebell by Mountcrest Sellman. Montabell was out of Jinglebells bred by Roland Hill, who based his program on that of Richard Sellman. Jinglebells was out of Texanita by Texas Allen out of Anita B. Another Sellman bred mare. The sire of Jinglebells was Querido , a full brother to Mansfield. Both Kitty E- the dam of Mountcrest Sellman - and Anita B were sired by The Admiral. Classic Sellman breeding indeed. Jane Abbey was the dam of OH-Cee's Gift. Jane Abbey was sired by Raragraph a son of Jubilee King and Nella. Raragraph was bred by JC Brunk. Nella was renown as a superb broodmare , producing at least eleven foals. Betty Barr was the dam of Jane Abbey, she was also the dam of Barberry who is behind Shazam, sire of Treasure Incantation. Betty Barr was by Penrod out of Daisy Knox.

LBF Amazing Grace is a very strongly bred filly, and with all the great athletic horses behind her it comes as no surprise that she indeed is her name personified. With The Corrells, The Brunks, The Sellmans, The solid US Government Farm, The Old Midwestern, Old Montana, and Old Vermont bloodlines she has- I would expect no less than superb athletic ability from this filly. Her extended family held a great many working western horses right on up to her sire in fact. When she joins the broodmare ranks later on, her contribution should not only be athletic , sane, sound and strong produce, but beautiful produce as well.
